PASTOR'S CORNER: Tomorrow, Monday, April 25, the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed from 3:00pm until 8:00pm in the chapel. I would encourage you to come and spend some time in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament, and to pray especially for our young members who will be Confirmed and make their First Communion during this coming week. I would encourage especially the parents and families of these candidates to come and pray together as a family in preparation for the sacraments. By bringing the candidates to pray before the Blessed Sacrament would help them to prepare spiritually for these sacraments. As a parish community coming together in prayer on Monday would also be a great sign to these candidates that the reception of these sacraments takes place within the context of a supportive and loving community. With that said, there will also be plenty of room in the church for members of the community to come in prayer for both Confirmation (April 28th, 7:00pm) and First Communion (May 1st, 1:00pm). These are not private Masses for just the immediate family but celebrations of the entire community.
