PASTOR'S CORNER: It was decided a couple of years ago by the Parish Council to recognize the faith life of our youth and to promote their growth in faith as they head off to college. A scholarship fund was established as a way to encourage our youth to continue to not only practice their faith but to grow in it as they move into the next stage of their lives. The scholarship application asks two questions: How has the parish influenced your life and how have you contributed to the parish community? How do you plan to further strengthen and develop your spirituality and how will you put your faith in action into the future? The Scholarship Committee this year consisted of Julie Gauvreau, Bernadette Gross and Mark Manning. Due to the generosity of parishioners with our annual collection for the Scholarship Fund they were able to give two scholarships to graduating High School students and one to a current college student, of \$500 each. The High School graduates are PJ Hruby and Beth Plas. The college student is Madison Filipiak. As I read the essays that were submitted with the applications I was impressed with the faith life of these students. All three mentioned how their service to Family Promise and Helping Hands ministries had a profound impact on their lives. At the graduation Mass, Zachary Siefker who was a past scholarship recipient and who recently graduated from Ohio Wesleyan was in attendance. It was good to see him celebrate his accomplishments and know that the parish still has a place in his life as he now moves out into the work force. Please keep our young people in your prayers. Whether they are away at college or at work or military service they are still influenced by our faith. And we are recipients of their growth in faith as they challenge us to further growth.

MISSION SUNDAY: Next weekend (June 18 -19), Fr. Gregory Olikenyi will visit our parish to speak at the Masses about the missionary work of the Church and in particular that of the Congregation of the Holy Spirit ('the Spiritans'), earlier known as the Holy Ghost Fathers.

This visit is part of a national program whereby annually a representative of one of the missionary groups visits parishes of the Diocese to enlist support for the mission work of the Church. The Congregation of the Holy Spirit is an international community engaged in a wide range of missionary activity in many areas of the world. Fr. Gregory himself is from Nigeria. He presently is a professor of theology at Duquesne University in Pittsburgh specializing in mission studies and inculturation.

Sister Kathleen's Corner

PARISH FAITH FORMATION: The filmmaker George Lucas is quoted as having said, "We are all living in cages with the door wide open." The readings today all emphasize that forgiveness leads us out of the cages that hold us captive. Cages of persistent pride, relentless resentment, boulder-sized shoulder chips, white-hot anger, cutting jealousy, and growing greed...at certain times in our lives we are thrown into these cages by the actions of another. More often the case that we fashion and form the bars of our personal prison by our own choosing. Rather than acknowledging ourselves as sinners who are loved by God, we berate and belittle ourselves. Sinners are full of love and mercy because God chooses to "dwell with sinners". In God's mercy, we try each day to forgive ourselves and others so that we are set free to walk out of

the cage into love. (Creighton and Living with Christ provided insights for this reflection.)

FAMILY FAITH FORMATION: Sometimes when a shooter tries to connect to the basket or team member, it lands right, sometimes not. The sinner in today's gospel knew exactly where her target was, even though, those around her tried to block her. Some of her plays in life were not the best. She acknowledged that she knew that Jesus would help her. He did much to the dismay of some "important people" around the table. Sometimes, we find ourselves in Jesus' place. It might not be popular to "include the outsider". How about taking a free throw: free in our way of connecting with those "not included" among the righteous. Let's try it this week.
